Kyushu University (formerly Kyushu Imperial University) was established in 1911 as the fourth Imperial university after Tokyo, Kyoto and Tohoku. Kyushu University has four campuses with approximately 19,000 students and 8,000 faculty members.

Kyushu University began relocating to Ito Campus in 2005. In 2018, the relocation was completed, making Ito Campus one of the largest single campuses in Japan. Ito Campus has an extensive range of state-of the-art equipment and buildings in a rich natural environment, forming a world-leading research and education hub. Kyushu University has put great effort into making the campus favorabl and open to the local communit


## Central Library
