Kyushu University (formerly Kyushu Imperial University) was established in 1911 as the fourth Imperial university after Tokyo, Kyoto and Tohoku. Kyushu University has four campuses with approximately 19,000 students and 8,000 faculty members.

Kyushu University began relocating to Ito Campus in 2005. In 2018, the relocation was completed, making Ito Campus one of the largest single campuses in Japan. Ito Campus has an extensive range of state-of-the-art equipment and buildings in a rich natural environment, forming a world-leading research and education hub. Kyushu University has put great effort into making the campus favorable and open to the local community.

# Grounds

## One of the largest single campuses in Japan

Ito Campus is one of the largest single campuses in Japan, measuring approximately 3 km east to west and 2.5 km north to south, with an area of roughly 272 hectares.

## Rich natural environment

To maintain a sustainable balance with our rich natural environment, we have set aside 100 of the campus' 272 hectares as a Biodiversity Conservation Zone.

The total area is equivalent to about 40 PayPay domes!

## World-class research and education center

As a world-class research and education center, Ito Campus has an extensive range of state-of-the-art equipment and buildings.

## West Zones 1-4

West Zones 1-4 house the education and research facilities for the Engineering, Mathematics, and Science departments. Various exhibits and art displays are set up in the entrance hall and other areas.



## West Zone 5

West Zone 5 is the center of agricultural research and education. The building's facade resembles a rice field and features (three multi-purpose entrance halls with) spacious two-story atriums.

## Central Library

The Central Library has a collection of more than 2.6 million books, making it one of the largest university libraries in the country.

## East Zones 1 & 2

East Zones 1 & 2 bring together all eight faculties in the humanities and social sciences. The buildings' exterior color scheme is reminiscent of traditional Hakata-ori textile patterns.

## The Biggest Crystal in Japan

The Biggest Crystal in Japan was discovered in 1946 at the Umatai Shirokawa Mine in Shimane Prefecture by Dr. Yohachiro Okamoto of the Kyushu University School of Engineering.



## Large Anchor from the Shipbuilding Laboratory

A Large Anchor from the Shipbuilding Laboratory, donated by Ishikawajima-Harima Heavy Industries Co., Ltd., is a 6-ton, 5.1-by-3.1-meter stock anchor. The anchor sits on a slab of granite that was used in the old shipbuilding classroom at Hakoza Campus.



## Our on-campus dormitories accommodate all student needs.



Dormitories I-III can house up to 650 students all together. Dormitory I has the Yazuya Floor, an international student floor funded by Yazuya Co., Ltd., while Dormitory III is shared between Japanese and international students.

## Ito Guest House

Ito Guest House is a wooden residential facility for international researchers engaged in education and research at Kyushu University. It has a total of 33 residential units, one multipurpose hall, and multiple meeting rooms as well as Japanese-style rooms on the first floor.

- Please ensure that no garbage is left behind from your visit.
- Smoking is prohibited throughout the University.
- You are not allowed to post pictures or videos of the university's students or staff members on social media, or publish them for journalistic purposes.
- The University is not responsible for accidents, etc. incurred while visiting.
- Please do not park on the streets in the surrounding area, as it obstructs traffic.
