## Practical Study of Safe and Convenient International Remote Medical Education using Information and Communication Technology

Chair: Assoc. Prof. Fumihiko Yokota (Research Promotion Coordinator of Q-AOS)

Telemedicine include not only remote patient care, but also remote consultations and medical educations among medical professionals. Telemedicine Development Center of Asia (TEMDEC) has been promoting international remote medical education using the Internet since 2002, and has conducted telemedicine programs, such as "case conferences", "case consultations" and "live demonstrations" with 1147 facilities in 79 countries. In the face of travel restrctions due to COVID-19 pandemic, telemedicine, which provides daily educational opportunities even under pandemic, is receiving a great deal of attention around the world. In this presentation, I will introduce the practical research on the utilization and dissemination of various telemedicine education which we have conducted, and the possibility of future utilization.

Kuriko Kudo is an Assistant Professor and Vice Director of Telemedicine Development Center of Asia (TEMDEC) at Kyushu University Hospital. Although medical field was unfamiliar with her, she started to work at TEMDEC in 2011. Her research has been focusing on technology development and engineer training for global remote medical education. She is now the Board member of Asia Pacific Advanced Network (APAN) Medical Working Group which promote to provide better healthcare and medical education using Internet.
