Current Situation and Challenges of EU Integration -- Envisaging the Future of Asia.

Chair: Assoc. Prof. Fumihiko Yokota (Research Promotion Coordinator of Q-AOS)

Since the establishment of the European Coal and Steel Community (ECSC) in 1951, the European Union (EU) has "deepened" integration to realize a single market and a single currency in the history of about 70 years. In addition, the number of member countries has increased from the initial 6 countries to a maximum of 28 countries (currently 27 countries) through "enlargement", and it is now forming an important pole of the world economy. On the other hand, in recent years, there has been negative topics such as the issue of the euro system since the Greek government debt crisis and the withdrawal of the UK (Brexit). From the perspective of studying EU integration for more than 30 years since graduate school, I will consider the past, present, and near future of EU integration, keeping in mind economic integration in the Asian region including Japan.

He has been involved in research and education on the EU for over 30 years, leading research on EU financial and monetary integration.
