Precautions for conducting international research activities from the perspective of international legal affairs: -contracts and export controls-

Chair: Prof. Scott Valentine (Research Promotion Director of Q-AOS)

In this Seminar, I introduce the points of precautions when conducting international research activities as an academic researcher, especially from the perspective of international legal affairs that have become increasingly important in the global academic community in recent years. In 2011, Kyushu University established the International Legal Office, ahead of other universities in Japan, which has been promoting international research and educational activities. In 2019, it was reorganized into the Integrated Legal Office, which handles not only international legal affairs but also domestic legal affairs. Since 2011, the office has handled more than 5,000 international legal affairs cases. I will share some cases related to international contracts and risk management in which research activities are conducted based on foreign government funds, as well as cases relates to export control, which have recently become hot issues. In addition to such points of precautions for researchers, I would like you to understand the importance of having legal function in the university.
