CENTER ZONE

The New Face of Kyushu University

The Center Zone is home to facilities for our KIKAN education program, general education courses for first-year undergraduates. It houses facilities for research and education, student support, and extracurricular activities as well as a Campus Mall that connects the Ito Campus' East and West Zones. Open, transparent exteriors welcome visitors and encourage student activity, while bright colors invite anyone to come and enjoy this central open space.

Shiiki Hall was built to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Kyushu University with a generous donation from late businessman Masakazu Shiiki. It is home to the university's central administrative offices, and the 3,000-seat Concert Hall and huge, semi-circular Main Galleria, make Shiiki Hall the center of many academic and cultural events and a landmark of the school.

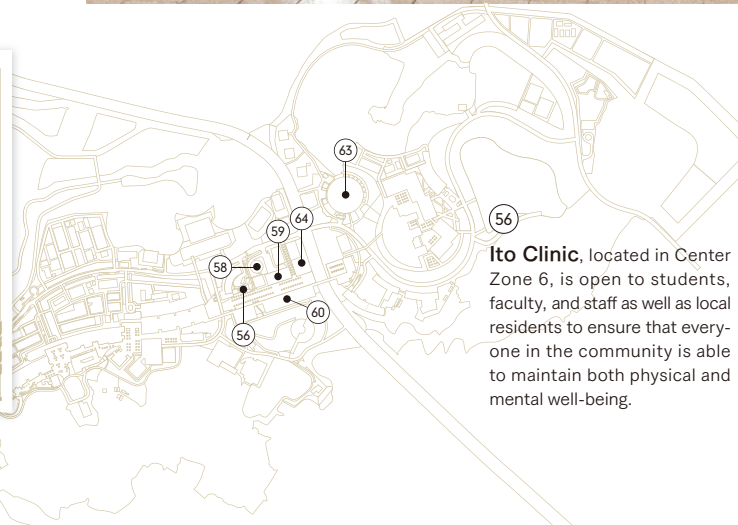

At the base of the statue is an engraving of a founding principle of Kyushu University, a quote from Yamakawa's inaugural address as president. The engraving features the script of a student from the Kyushu University Calligraphy Club. 2 Big Orange is Kyushu University's information center. Here you can find information on campus tours and watch the university's latest promotional videos. The building was designed to resemble an orange slice and named in honor of the area's long history of growing mandarin oranges.

WEST ZONE

An Expansive Academic & Research Complex

The West Zone is home to the education and research facilities of the Engineering, Mathematics, Science, and Agriculture departments and the impressive collection of the Science and Technology Library. The zone is arranged to allow for smooth movement between its wide range of facilities while most efficiently serving the needs of lectures, research, and other experimental activities. The buildings were designed to blend into the mountains that surround the campus.

To maintain a sustainable balance with our rich natural environment, we have set aside 100 of the campus' 272 hectares as a **Biodiversity Conservation Zone**, in line with our goals of seed conservation and sustainable forest management. We have also included the surrounding wetlands to allow for transplantation and conservation of wild plants and animals, especially rare species.

West Zone 5 is the center of agricultural research and education. The building's facade resembles a rice field at harvest and features three multi-purpose entrance halls with spacious two-story atriums.

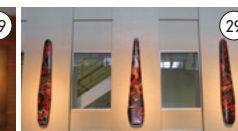

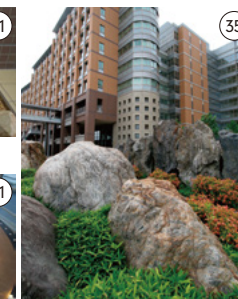

EAST ZONE



A New Symbol of Diversity & Freedom

The East Zone is home to Kyushu University's humanities and social sciences as well as the Central Library, one of the largest university libraries in the country. Its completion marks the final stage in the university's relocation to Ito Campus. Its design is human focused, both figuratively and literally, with the humanities buildings on top of the library, creating a human-centered space that is free of cars and other motor vehicles. An observation deck provides beautiful views of the campus and its surroundings.

East Zones 1 & 2 bring together all eight faculties in the humanities and social sciences, allowing for a wide range of activities and interactions to unfold. The buildings' exterior color scheme is reminiscent of traditional Hakata-ori textile patterns.

The **Central Library** has a collection of more than 2.6 million books, making it the largest university library in the country. A place of active learning and a catalyst for world-class research, the Central Library is a gateway that connects the university with both the local community and the world.

The **Exhibition and Observation Room of Ishigahara Tumulus** was designed to match the former location and altitude of the ancient *kofun* burial mound. On exhibit are cross sections excavated from the Ishigahara Tumulus as well as information on ruins and ancient tombs located in and around Ito Campus. From the observation deck, you have a panoramic view of the Center and West Zones as well as the ocean and Fukuoka Tower.

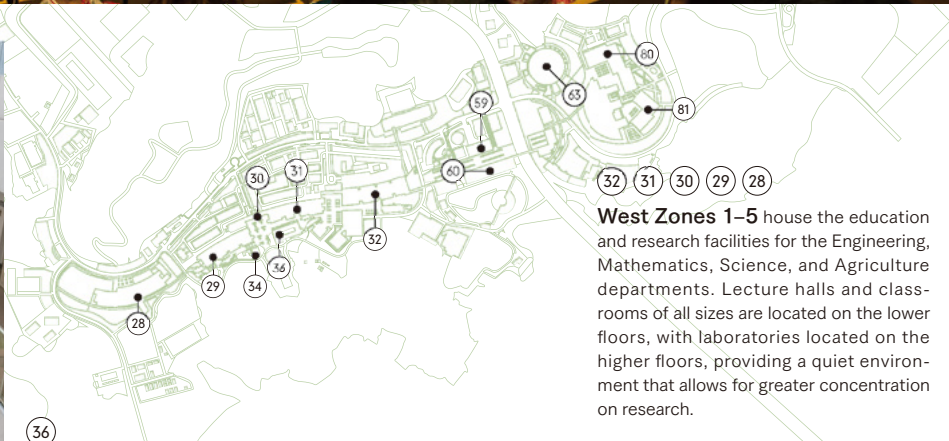

Shiiki Hall, with its 3,000-seat Concert Hall, serves as a landmark of Kyushu University during important university functions such as entrance ceremonies, academic conferences, concerts, and exhibitions. It can be also used for lectures and is available to the general public for a range of purposes.

The **Open Learning Plaza** features a courtyard on the first floor where students and faculty can relax. There is also a green space on the rooftop that reduces energy consumption and helps to beautify the campus.



West Zones 1–5 house the education and research facilities for the Engineering, Mathematics, Science, and Agriculture departments. Lecture halls and classrooms of all sizes are located on the lower floors, with laboratories located on the higher floors, providing a quiet environment that allows for greater concentration on research.

Lecture Hall West is the common lecture building of the Department of Engineering. E-café is located on the first floor, and a skyway connects the building to West Zone 4.



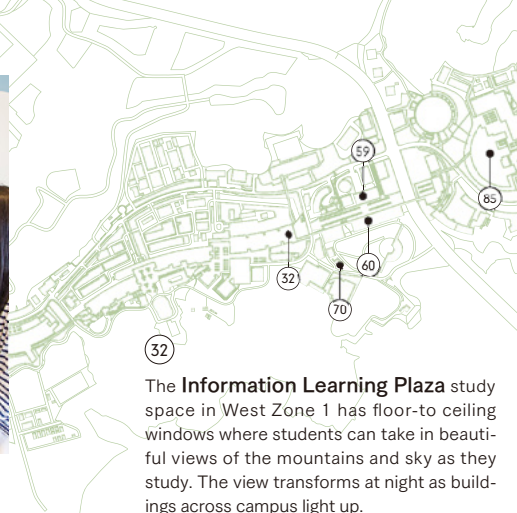

Center Zone 1 has classrooms, student support services, and information centers that help students adjust to life on campus. **Center Zone 2** also houses classrooms in addition to Cafeteria Qasis on the first floor and the fourth-floor Q-Commons, a learning and community space that can accommodate up to 200 students.

Tei-Tei-Sha House is a rest area open to students, faculty, and staff weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Made with wood locally sourced from right here in Fukuoka, it is a relaxing space that stays cool even in summer with the refreshing scent of the forest. It is named after a student meeting house on the former Ropponmatsu Campus, which was originally Fukuoka High School under the old education system. Construction was funded by charitable donations by Kyushu University alumni to the New Tei-Tei-Sha House Project, organized by the Kyushu University Alumni Consulting Laboratory, as well as donations from the Kyushu University Cooperative.

SALC is located in Center Zone 1 and aids independent English study through English conversation classes, TOEFL and IELTS exam prep, and access to English-language materials such as newspapers, magazines, and other literature. Students wanting to go overseas can also come here to talk with students who have previously studied abroad.

The **Information Learning Plaza** study space in West Zone 1 has floor-to ceiling windows where students can take in beautiful views of the mountains and sky as they study. The view transforms at night as buildings across campus light up.

Learning and Community Space “Q-Commons” is an open study space on the fourth floor of Center Zone 2. It is also where students can come to receive learning support services from graduate students.

The **Central Library** provides access to open stacks of more than two million books in its central atrium, where students can connect with a century's worth of accumulated knowledge and study at a number of tables and chairs that accommodate all kinds of learning styles.

International Institute for Carbon-Neutral Energy Research (I²CNER) is a research facility where world-class scientists are focused on the cross-disciplinary research needed to achieve a low-carbon society.

Next-Generation Fuel Cell Research Center (NEXT-FC) conducts closely coordinated industry-academia-government collaborative research aimed at full-scale dissemination of next-generation fuel cells. Pictured below are two fuel cell vehicles and a large 250 kW-class solid oxide fuel cell (SOFC) power generation system.



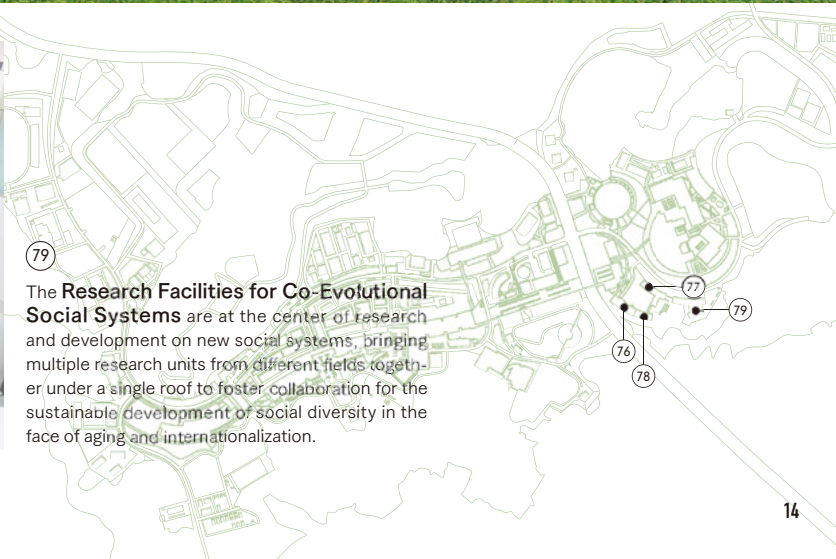

The latest research facilities and an environment designed for collaboration are why so many researchers choose Ito Campus when conducting cutting-edge research. We go beyond the university to collaborate on commissioned and joint research with private industry and leverage university resources to form industry-academia-government partnerships—all in the name of giving back to society.

The **Research Facilities for Co-Evolutional Social Systems** are at the center of research and development on new social systems, bringing multiple research units from different fields together under a single roof to foster collaboration for the sustainable development of social diversity in the face of aging and internationalization.

Center for Accelerator and Beam Applied Science (CABAS) was established as a center for research into a wide range of fields that include the life sciences, energy engineering, and basic science as it relates to quantum beam and nuclear science. It is comprised of an FFAG accelerator, a tandem accelerator (pictured), and a gamma ray irradiation facility. The tandem accelerator is expected to aid in the development of particle detectors capable of discovering new elements beyond nihonium (Nh).

The **Seakeeping and Manoeuvring Basin / High-Speed Circulating Water Channel** make Kyushu University unique as the only university in Japan to have two experimental research facilities related to ships and floating bodies. The ship model basin is one of the largest in the nation, while the water channel can generate very fast flows.

The **Research Center for Planetary Trace Organic Compounds** was established to study precious asteroidal materials such as meteorites, complete with a dedicated clean room to minimize terrestrial contamination. The center has plans to analyze samples collected by the Hayabusa2 spacecraft upon its return in 2020.

Pictured here at the **Engineering Department Experimental Facilities** is a hydraulic landscape model experiment of the Watershed Management Laboratory. Results of such experiments will inform future river improvement projects and build consensus with local government and residents.



The **Ultramicroscopy Research Center (Research Laboratory for High Voltage Electron Microscopy)** houses a sophisticated high-voltage electron microscope equipped with an in-column, omega-type energy filter and an SDD-type x-ray detector. It provides a range of services as well access to its state-of-the-art electron microscopes for researchers and students from both in and outside of the university.

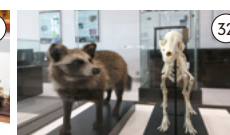

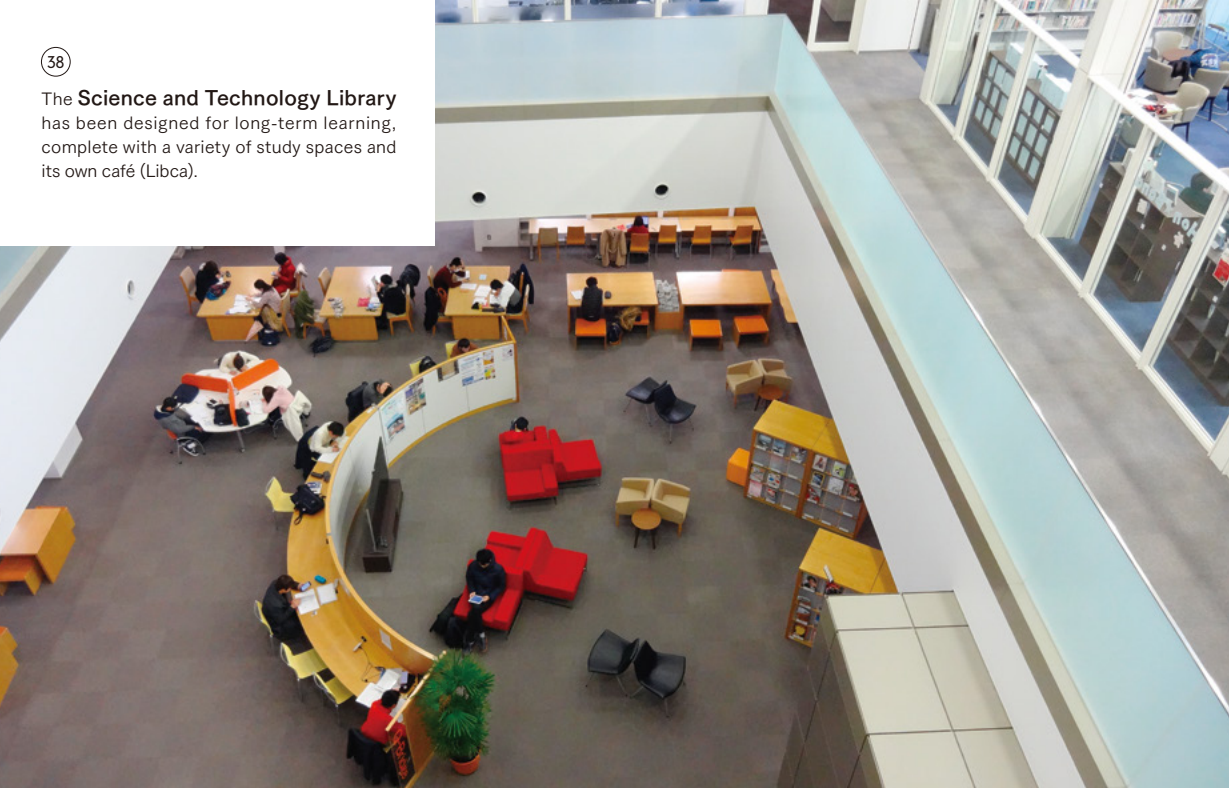

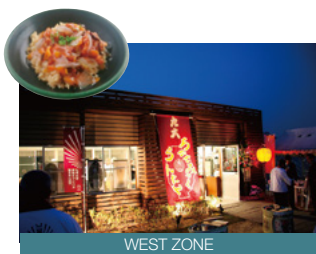
The **Structural Building Engineering Laboratory** has a Loading Test System for Large Structural Members and Assemblies that can conduct vertical loading tests up to 10 MN (approx. 1,000 tons), boasting one of the largest loading capacities among Japanese universities. Combined with our 2 MN lateral loading system (far back right of photo), it allows for extensive loading experiments on components of large-scale structures.

The **Laboratory for Silkworm Bioresources** is a facility dedicated to the collection, storage, and utilization of important bioresources related to silkworm research. Ito Campus is home to more varieties of silkworm than anywhere else in the world. The coloring of the silkworms seen here is the result of a naturally occurring genetic mutation without human intervention.

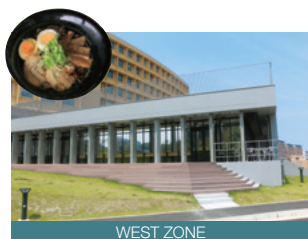

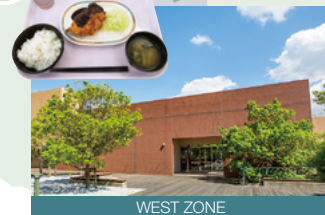

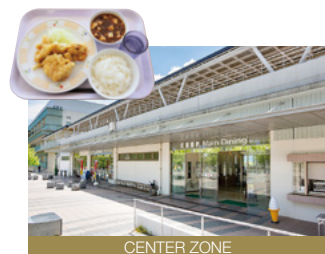

The **Jonathan KS Choi Cultural Centre of Japan** was built with donations from Dr. Jonathan Choi, Chairman of the Hong Kong-based Sunwah Group, to promote education and research exchange in the fields of East Asian history and culture. It has a multipurpose hall that seats 120 as well as meeting rooms for small groups.

With plenty of meeting spaces for any occasion, Ito Campus is an excellent venue for academic conferences and hosts a large number of events both inside and outside the university.

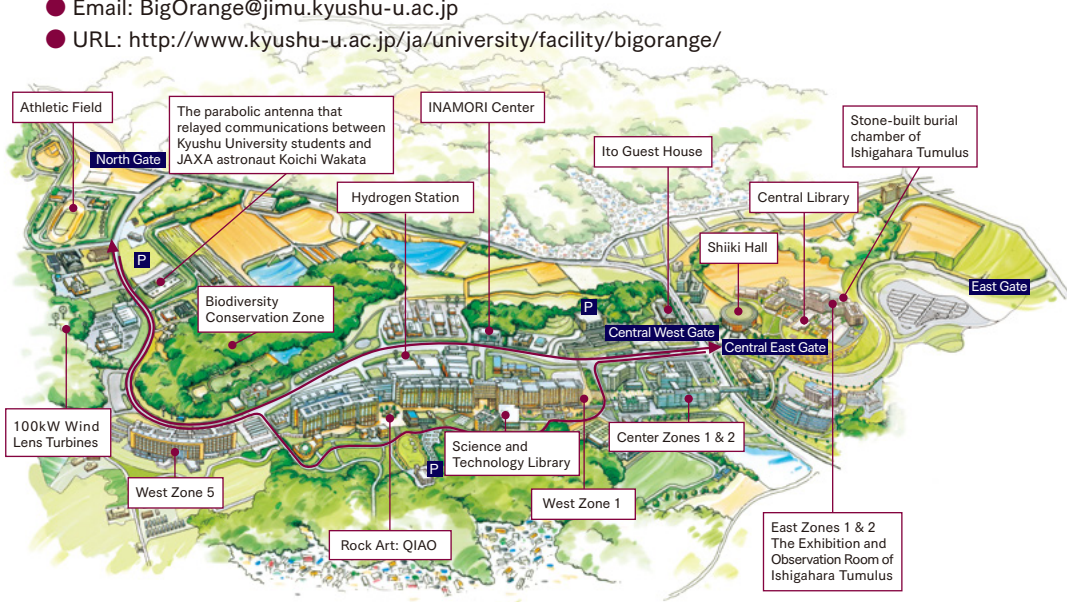

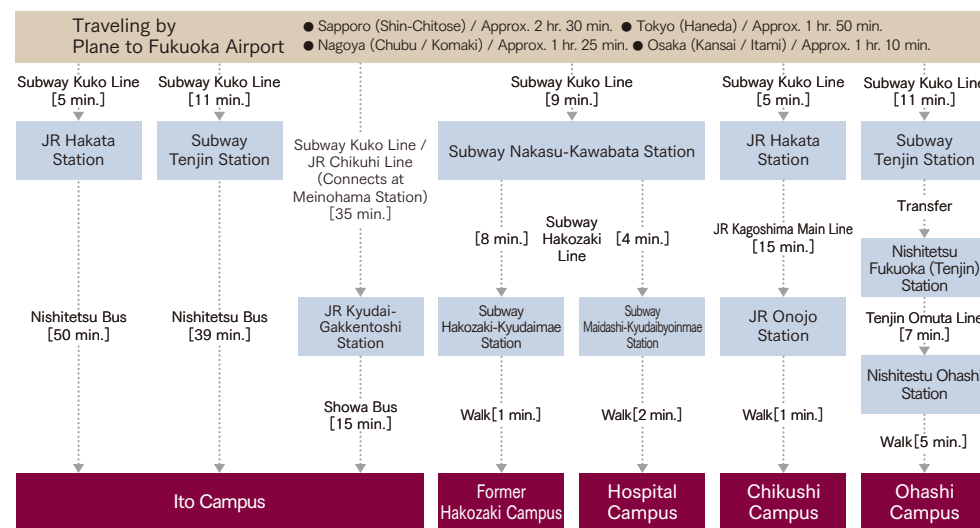
