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Rules for using AI to be described in syllabus (Regarding the use of interactive and generative AI such as ChatGPT)

When rules for using AI in lectures, practical training, etc. are clearly indicated in the syllabus, etc., they should be indicated using the following rules 1 through 4.

Rule 1: When use is free

Explanation; Use of generative AI is permitted on all levels. Please feel free to use it in class, in preparation for review, and in making reports and other works. Please follow the instructions of the instructor regarding whether or not to write about the use of the AI in your reports.

Rule 2: Limiting the number of available places

Explanation: The use of generative AI is permitted in the following cases. Use in other situations is prohibited. If this rule is violated, it will be recognized as a violation of instructions and appropriate measures will be taken.

<Available situations

(Listed by each faculty member)

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Example of options for teachers:

Lecture (Humanities)] Summarizing lecture materials, drafting reports, reviewing literature, translating texts, etc.

Lecture (Science)] Summarizing lecture materials, drafting reports, debugging, calculating formulas, etc.

Experiments] Propose experimental design, analyze data, interpret results, analyze errors, etc.

Exercises] Drafting resumes, drafting designs, drafting presentation materials, etc.

Note: These are just a few value-neutral, possible use cases, and WG does not intend to present them as available.

Rule 3: When use is completely prohibited

DESCRIPTION: Use is prohibited. Use in class is strictly prohibited, and any violation of this rule will be recognized as a violation of instructions and appropriate action will be taken.

Rule 4: Miscellaneous
