Founded in 1911, Kyushu University, as a leading research-oriented institution of higher education located in Fukuoka has created a profound cultural and economic impact that extends beyond campus and borders. Celebrating its centennial in 2011, Kyushu University has embarked on its second century with a renewed commitment to creating greater impact. In 2021, selected as a **Designated National University Corporation** by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), Kyushu University has set the stage for its next steps towards becoming a university that drives social change with integrative knowledge, aligning with Kyushu University VISION 2030.

Located in Fukuoka City, Kyushu University is comprised of four campuses, each with a specialized focus. The Ito Campus serves as a hub for integrated science and experimental research, while the Hospital Campus is central to life and medical sciences. The Chikushi Campus focuses on the fusion of cutting-edge sciences, and the Ohashi Campus centers around innovative design. Together, these campuses facilitate excellence in research and education.



MIRAI is a network of Swedish and Japanese universities dedicated to fostering long-term research collaboration and promoting research excellence. In January 2024, MIRAI entered its third phase (2024-2026), with Kyushu University taking a leading role as the coordinator of the Japanese member universities. Leveraging this leadership position, Kyushu University contributed to the launch, highlighted by its success in the kick-off event and the Global Challenges Winter School. Moving forward, the university will continue strengthening connections with external stakeholders.

# 10 universities from UK and Japan

RENKEI, Research and Education Network for Knowledge Economy Initiatives, is a pioneering initiative for research collaboration between the UK and Japan, fostering multilateral and interdisciplinary collaboration especially in the priority areas of "Climate Change" and "Health". Kyushu University has been actively engaged since RENKEI's establishment in 2012. This commitment was demonstrated in December 2024 when the university hosted an onsite workshop for RENKEI researchers on climate change and energy.

To realize this vision, built on a wide network of partner institutions worldwide, Kyushu University is establishing strategic partnerships to enhance educational and research collaborations with selected institutions.

#### Strategic partner since 2019

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) became Kyushu University's first strategic partner in August 2019 through mutual recognition. Since then, both universities have proactively worked to further enhance collaboration. These efforts include funding for focused research areas, fostering dialogue at both leadership and faculty levels, as well as facilitating student and administrative staff exchanges.

#### Strategic partner since 2023

In September 2023, the National Taiwan University (NTU) became Kyushu University's second strategic partner. This partnership was formalized during the visit of the NTU President, who delivered a speech at Kyushu University's commencement ceremony in 2023. The two universities subsequently concluded a strategic partnership agreement with the aim of deepening and expanding the scope of exchanges, particularly focusing on enhancing student mobility.

#### High priority partner since 2019

Since November 2019, Kyushu University and Seoul National University (SNU) recognized each other's significance and committed to strengthening their ties. They initiated this effort by holding a joint symposium, with the first symposium taking place in 2020. The collaboration has flourished, and Kyushu University is now actively working towards hosting the next symposium, where they will discuss the continued development of their collaborations.

#### Kick-start into a New Phase: Trilateral University Partnership

Building on their track record of exchange as strategic partners as above, UIUC, NTU and Kyushu University jointly established a trilateral university center, marked by a MoU signing ceremony held at NTU in February 2024. Aiming to further expand and deepen international collaborations especially in research, the establishment of this alliance led to successful workshop and meetings at UIUC in November 2024.
